He serves on the panel of numerous international arbitral institutions and organisations.

He was also the co-author of "Arbitration Act 2005 – UNCITRAL Model Law as Applied in Malaysia" (2007), "The PAM 2006 Form" (2010), "Construction Law in Malaysia" (2012) and "Arbitration in Malaysia: A Practical Guide" (2016).
