

INCREASING THE TIME AND COST EFFICIENCY OF ARBITRATION

- IS THE GERMAN APPROACH VIABLE IN AN INTERNATIONAL CONTEXT?

Increasing the time and cost efficiency of arbitration has become a major concern of the users of arbitration and, as a consequence, a challenge for arbitrators and arbitral institutions. This talk will provide attendees with a view on Civil Law, mainly German procedural law instruments fostering the efficiency of dispute resolution, such as early and ongoing assessment of the merits, promotion of settlements and a more managerial role of arbitrators. It will discuss whether and to which extent such features of the German approach can and should be used in an international context. It will also deal with the argument, often raised in Common Law arbitration communities, that a managerial approach of the arbitration tribunal

would imply bias and, hence, should be discarded.
