Session 2 - Smooth Sailing or Legal Storm? Navigating Shipping Disputes with ADR

Panellists will explore how Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) continues to serve as a practical, efficient and commercially viable pathway for resolving shipping and maritime disputes in Penang. At the heart of Penang's maritime and logistics hub, the complexity of contractual risks, port investment, port and shipping-related liabilities and cross-border trade conflicts have routinised into what we called the "daily business".
