The AIAC Certificate in Adjudication is conducted by the AIAC as part of its role as the adjudication authority under the Construction Industry Payment and Adjudication Act 2012 ("CIPAA"). The AIAC Certificate in Adjudication is open to all individuals in the construction industry, whether legally trained or not legally trained, who are interested in serving as an adjudicator under the CIPAA in adjudicating payment claim disputes. Apart from training future adjudicators and providing them with the necessary skills to conduct an adjudication, this programme is equally suitable for those who are merely seeking more knowledge on construction adjudication and are not desirous of being qualified adjudicators. The AIAC Certificate in Adjudication is recognised by the CIPA Regulations as a necessary qualification to become an adjudicator under the CIPAA empanelled with the AIAC, subject further to the necessary qualifications of seven (7) years of working experience in relevant fields. The training is conducted over five (5) days by experts from the U4 construction industry and consists of these specialised units:


KEVIN PRAKASH has an active practice in dispute resolution and has been involved in complex disputes in various forms since being called to the Malaysian Bar in 1998.

### TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. Participants must pay a course fee of **RM6,890** (incl. SST), which is inclusive of the examination registration fee and examination fee. Participants who attend the course and pass the examinations will be awarded with a 'AIAC Certificate in Adjudication'
- Participants who do not wish to sit for the examination will be awarded a 'AIAC Certificate of Attendance' A payment of RM5,830 (incl. SST) is chargeable for the course only.
- 3. As a pre-requisite to being empanelled to the AIAC Panel of Adjudicators, participants must have successfully completed the AIAC Certificate in Adjudication and passed both examinations thereunder. Successful completion of the AIAC Certificate in Adjudication does not automatically qualify participants for empanelment into the AIAC Panel of Adjudicators. Empanelment to the AIAC Panel of Adjudicators and receipt of appointments to adjudicate construction disputes is conditional on the satisfactory fulfilment of the necessary seven (7) years of working experience as per the CIPA Regulations.
- 4. This form shall be submitted with the full information and supporting documents, as required herein and signed by the participant. The AIAC may reject any incomplete forms.
- 5. The AIAC reserves the right to reject late submissions of this form.
- 6. All participants who register for the Adjudication Training Programme examinations are allowed to re-sit either one or both examination(s) **ONCE**. For the re-sit attempt, a participant will have to pay the registration fee and examination fee of **RM500** (inc. SST) per examination.
- 7. Participants who choose to attend the AIAC Certificate in Adjudication for the purpose of obtaining the "AIAC Certificate of Attendance" only are **not allowed** to use the "AIAC Certificate of Attendance" for any future sitting of the AIAC Certificate in Adjudication examinations. These participants will be expected and required to attend the entirety of the AIAC Certificate in Adjudication anew should they wish to undertake and sit for the examinations.
- 8. Substitutions may be made for registered participants if written notification is provided to the AIAC before the commencement of the AIAC Certificate in Adjudication course, and the new participant satisfied all requirements as contained herein.
- 9. A 50% refund will be given for cancellations made in writing before **25<sup>th</sup> February 2022**. A cheque for refund in the payee's name will be issued within 30 days from the day of cancellation. No refund will be given after the deadline.
- 10. Please enclose the following documents for the AIAC's verification purposes:
  - a) Relevant degree or diploma transcripts;
  - b) Curriculum Vitae; and
  - c) Any other supporting documents
- 11. Please be informed that all documents submitted to the AIAC must be **certified true copies**. Please do not send your original transcripts. Alternatively, participants may produce the original transcripts together with copies to the AIAC authorised personnel for verification.
